The Friends of the Scott County Public Library, Inc. will award one \$1,000 scholarship each year, if they have received applications that meet the required criteria. The Joe Manfredo Scholarship is designed to provide financial assistance to individuals intending to pursue or continue a professional career in library science, but may be extended to applicants who are pursuing further education in other library-related fields of study. The scholarship is available to graduates of a high school in Scott County or individuals currently employed in a recognized library in Scott County, Kentucky, who wish to continue their professional education and training.


The scholarship recipient will be selected by the Friends of the Scott County Public Library Board of Directors on the basis of scholarship, character, demonstrated interest in library support and/or advocacy, and participation in school and community activities.

To be eligible to apply and, if selected, to receive the Joe Manfredo Scholarship, the following guidelines will be considered:

- *Preference will be given to residents of Scott County (KY)
- *Preference will be given to graduates of (or those scheduled to graduate) from a Scott County (KY) secondary school and have an interest in the field of library science
- *Preference will be given to an undergraduate or graduate student in a library field or library- related field (such as technology, elementary education, secondary education or school media) who is attending a post-secondary institution.
- *Preference may be given to an individual employed in a library position in a library located in Scott County (KY).

After reviewing your application, the Board may wish to contact you for an interview. This scholarship is for one year. Recipient will be awarded half of the scholarship funds for the Fall term. In order to maintain the scholarship, recipient must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.8 from the post-secondary institution in which recipient is enrolled A transcript must be submitted from the completed Fall term before the remaining scholarship funds will be awarded.
